Job Title: Lead Audio Visual Technician

### SUMMARY

The Lead Audio Visual Technician is responsible for performing assembly and installation of electronic equipment and system wiring as directed and specified in the project documentation which may include, but not limited to, rack assembly; pulling, labeling, terminating and testing structured cabling of cat5/6, video, RGB, HDMI, DVI and audio cables; and installing audio/video conferencing equipment, distributed audio, digital signage, sound reinforcement, video projection, control systems and flat panel and projection screen mounting.

Additionally, you will be responsible for reading and understanding assigned project documentation, and determining if additional information is required. Informing the Project Manager of any problems and concerns with assigned projects; maintaining updated as-built drawings and documentation for assigned projects, maintaining accurate inventory of parts and responsible for reporting daily time and activity to the Project Manager.
